The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) is the largest funding organisation in the world supporting the international exchange of students and scholars.

Since its foundation in 1925, more than 1.5 million scholars in Germany and abroad have received DAAD funding. It is a registered association and its members are German institutions of higher education and student bodies.

Its budget is derived mainly from the federal funding for various ministries, primarily the German Federal Foreign Office but also from the European Union and a number of enterprises, organisations and foreign governments. Its head office is in Bonn and it currently maintains a network of 14 branches and 50 Information Centers world wide.

Its activities go far beyond simply awarding grants and scholarships:

The DAAD also supports the internationalisation of German universities, promotes German studies and the German language abroad, assists developing countries in establishing effective universities and advises decision makers on matters of cultural, education and development policy.

Good Reasons to Study in Germany

More than 380 German universities enjoy an excellent reputation throughout the world and offer a diverse range of study opportunities (with some 1600 programmes in English). Due to the outstanding high quality of academic education and the close link between theory and practice, studying or doing research in Germany is a very enriching experience - both on a professional and on a personal level.

The DAAD scholarship portfolio for Jordan includes:

- > Full PhD-Scholarships (for all academic disciplines, deadline: Sept. 30th each year)

- > Master's scholarships for Public Policy and Good Governance (PPGG)
- > Short term grants (1 to 3 months) for academic researchers (deadline: Oct 31st each year)
- > University excursions for student groups
- > Summer schools for advanced learners of German
