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1. About UOP

The University of Petra (UOP) is a private university that was established in 1991. UOP is registered at the Ministry of Higher Education & Scientific Research (MOHE) and accredited by the Higher Education Accreditation Commission (HEAC) in Jordan. The University is also a member of the Association of Arab Universities.

UOP is located in the western part of the Jordanian capital, Amman. It is one of the most welcoming universities in Jordan. It is a home to seven faculties in a compact and friendly campus, where students really enjoy the opportunity to achieve their goals while developing a desire for lifelong learning. At UOP, we are committed to opening up quality education to students from a diverse range of backgrounds and experiences.

The challenges we face in this century are enormous. We live in a global village and are immediately affected by the surroundings in all lifestyles. The overlap of common interests among countries dictates a fresh intellectual approach in dealing with each other. - The minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) required to pass the Master Program is (3.00).
- A student may, in order to raise his/her GPA, repeat a maximum of two courses that she/he
 has studied before and passed them, during his/ her period of study and only the higher
 grades (in the repeated courses) are counted.

Registration Fees: Registration Fees for New Students for the Academic Year 2022-2023

- Registration Fees (Non-refundable): 200 JOD for regular semester and 100 for summer semester.
- Service Fees (Sports, arts and other activities) (Non-refundable): 170 JOD for regular semester and 85 JOD for summer semester.
- Insurance Fees (Refundable): 100 JOD for regular semester and 100 JOD for summer semester.
- Application Fees for the first time (pay on acceptance) (Non-refundable): 40 JOD.

- Placement Test Fees (pay on acceptance) (Non-refundable): 45 JOD (for Bachelor Students).

11. Accommodation Options

University Dormitory for Female Students

The female students' dormitory consists of single-bed and double-bed rooms, study rooms, reading rooms, TV and video watching rooms, recreational halls, kitchens, public services rooms equipped with washers and dryers, gym hall, billiards hall and garden attached thereto for female students residing in the dormitory only.

Dormitory's rents for the regular semester are as follows:

Penthouse apartment: 1050 Jordanian Dinars. One large single-bed room: 950 Jordanian Dinars. One small single-bed room: 850 Jordanian Dinars.

Double-bed room: 650 Jordanian dinars.

- The above rents do not cover the living and dining expenses.
- Dormitory rents in the summer semester are only 50% of the regular semester rents.
- The Deanship of Student Affairs receives the female students who will reside at the dormitory at Queen Alia International Airport and ensures their reach to the university, provided that the Deanship of Student Affairs is informed of the date of their arrival to Jordan at least two days in advance.
